# **COVID Update**

- Tara gave situational updates for counties Hinsdale in Blue, Mineral in Orange
- Tara gave SLV situational update. Numbers seem more under control in SLV.
- Tara gave update on Gunnison numbers and state trends.
- Tara has been advocating to state for more local control over the dial and state seems to be receptive.
- Conversations are taking place regarding rural metrics. Hopes to have more local control and more vaccine influence on metrics.
- There has been talk about the new COVID strain at the state level, but many unknowns as far as vaccine effectiveness, spread, how deadly, and testing.

# Vaccine Distribution Update

- Good turnout for the vaccine information webinar
- Both counties received 200 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> round doses
- State has made an update to Tier 1B (above 'the line' and below 'the line') 70+ and teachers have been added.
- Mineral and Hinsdale are both about to complete Tier A and B (above 'the line')
- Tara is working with the state on guidance regarding moving to new categories, once A and B (above 'the line') are complete, with left-over doses.
- Next week both counties will begin giving 2<sup>nd</sup> doses
- Federal government plans to release all 1<sup>st</sup> round doses, so state is working on how those will be distributed.
- Federal government has added individuals who are 65+ and 18+ with comorbidities to be eligible for the vaccine. That would add 2 million more people in Colorado to be eligible. The state makes the ultimate decision on eligibility and there has been no clear answer for Colorado.
- Now working with Regional Homeland Security on distribution
- Conversations about 2<sup>nd</sup> home owners wanting vaccines in our counties:

There has been no guidance on this by the state
Many counties are only vaccinating locals
We have had to turn down some 2 <sup>nd</sup> home owner due to our allocations, but realize the
need for flexibility

□ If there is a seasonal resident calling and asking to get the vaccine in one of our counties, we now base the decision on a "yes" answer to 2 questions:

 Are you currently here?
 Will you be here for the 2<sup>nd</sup> dose?

 □ Logistically, the person really needs to receive their 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> dose at the same location.
 □ Board in agreement with the process being used for seasonal residents.

 Silver Thread has opted to handle all local logistics of distribution
 □ Staff created a vaccine interest form for county residents to fill out so there is way to
